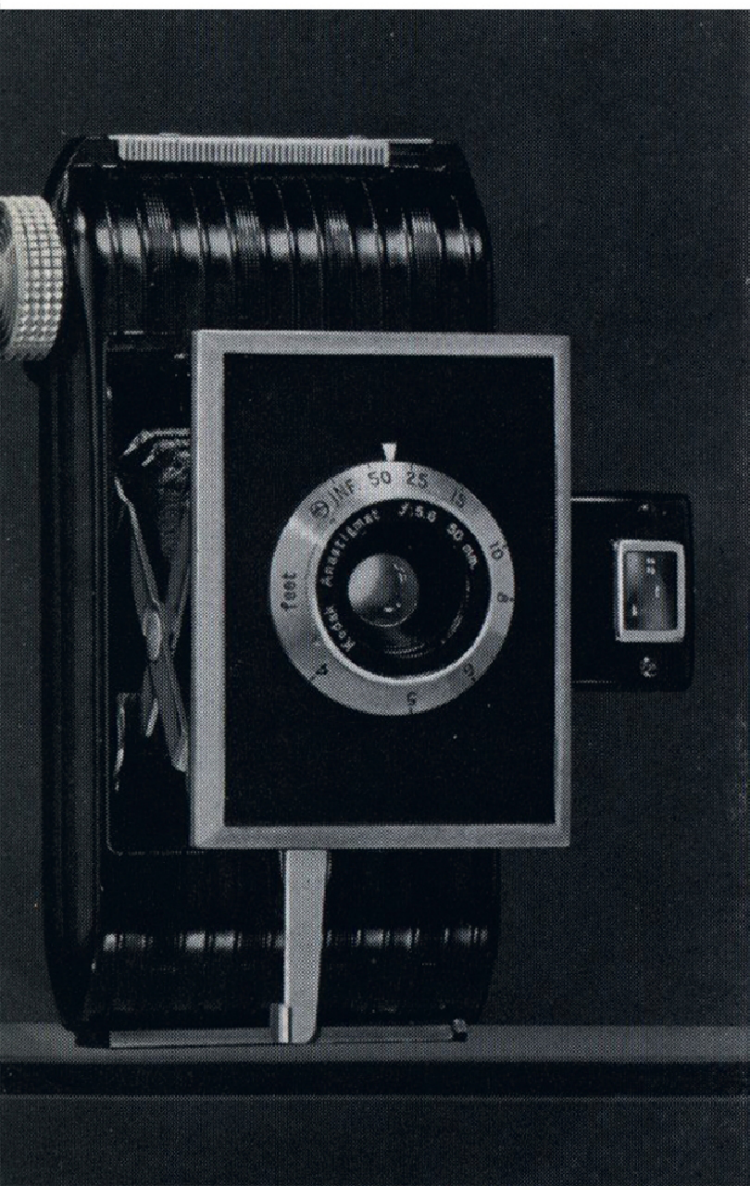

Its lens is the EKTAR $f.2.0$, a high-precision Kodak Anastigmat that performs outstandingly at all apertures. Supplementing it is the Compur-Rapid shutter (speeds to $1/500$ second).

The built-in range finder, of the split-field military type, is so arranged that movement of a single lever measures distances and focuses the camera. Has finely machined aluminum case, stainless-steel fittings, and film-centering device. Takes beautiful black-and-white or Kodachrome shots.



The built-in split field range finder gives large magnification of an image, is easy to use, accurate. Movement of a lever measures the distance between subject and lens and focuses the camera. 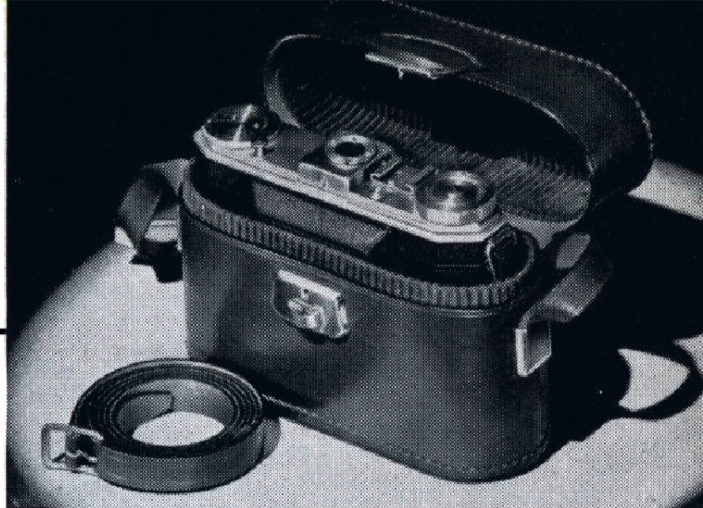

KODAK RETINA I

KODAK RETINA I is a precision-built, high-speed miniature of the 35-millimeter type. Lens and shutter equipment is out of the ordinary—Kodak Anastigmat EKTAR *f*.3.5 lens and 1/500 Compur-Rapid shutter. Among its features are exposure centering mechanism and exposure counter, depth-of-field indicator, enclosed direct-view finder, body shutter release, and a rigid bracket for attaching the Kodak Pocket Range Finder.

Kodak Retina I makes sharp, striking black-and-white pictures that can be enlarged successfully to imposing proportions. And, loaded with Kodachrome Film, it produces lovely full-color transparencies which can be viewed as they are or projected in large size on the home screen with a Kodaslide Projector.

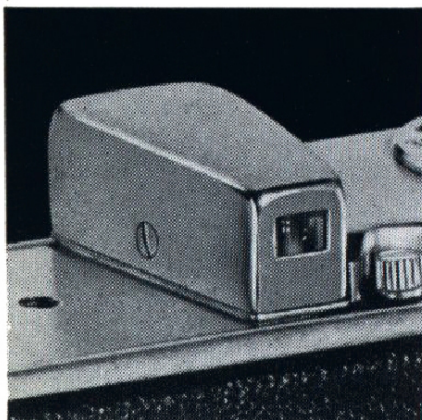
ABOVE—Detail shot of Kodak Retina I's automatic exposure counter.



ABOVE—Rotating outer ring of depth-of-field indicator shows focus range.

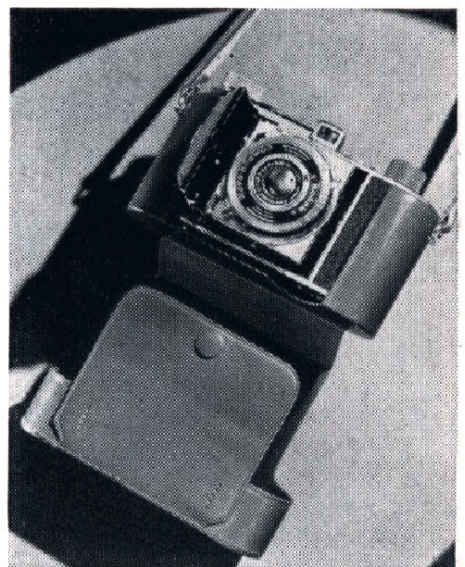

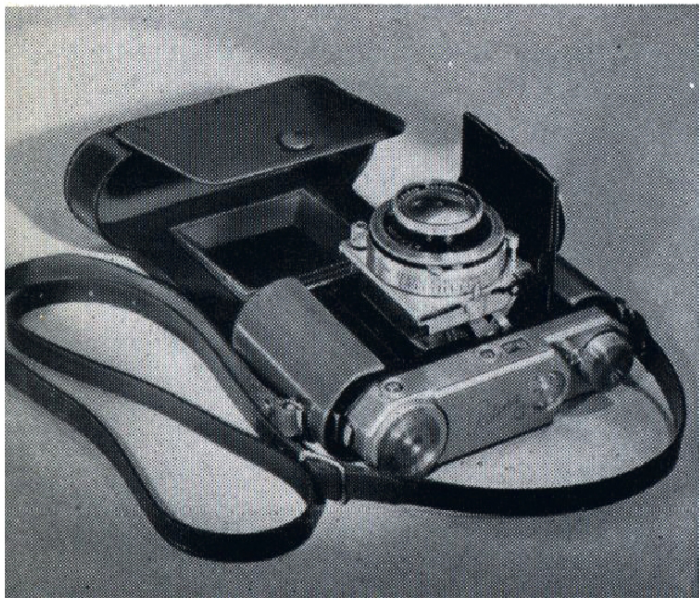

LENS ATTACHMENTS

FILTERS (for black-and-white work)

You will find the sizes, as well as the prices, listed under the individual cameras on the foregoing pages. For *Kodak Retinas I and II*, use the K-1 Wratten Filter when only a partial correction of color values is desired; the K-2 gives a better color correction; and the X-1, a full correction with daylight; the G filter is for cutting haze when taking a picture of a distant landscape.

Kodak Color Filters designed for *Kodak Bantam Special*; *Kodak Bantams*



f.4.5 and f.5.6; *Kodak 35's*, *f.3.5*, *f.4.5*, and *f.5.6*; and *Kodak Duo Six-20, Series II*, are for general usage in recording color values in black-and-white prints of highly colored landscapes, flowers, art objects, etc., with the cameras mentioned. These filters hold back the strong blue and violet rays, which affect the negative most quickly, and give the weaker shades time to register.

PORTRAIT ATTACHMENTS

Sizes of portrait attachments required, as well as prices, are listed under individual cameras on the foregoing pages. With *Kodak Retinas I and II*, one may take pictures with the shutter as close as 21 inches to the subject, with Portrait Attachment A; as close as

16 inches, with Portrait Attachment B; and as close as $12\frac{3}{8}$ inches, with Portrait Attachment C.

When used with the *Kodak Bantam Special*, Kodak Portrait Attachment (No. 5A) permits working distances down to $21\frac{1}{2}$ inches; Supplementary Lens II+ (No. 5A), down to $12\frac{3}{4}$ inches; Supplementary Lens III+ (No. 5A), down to $9\frac{7}{8}$ inches.

With *Kodak Bantam f.4.5 or f.5.6* and Kodak Portrait Attachment (No. 3), pictures may be taken with the camera as close as 25 inches to the subject. With *Kodak 35's f.3.5 and f.4.5* and Kodak Portrait Attachment (No. 5A), as close as 25 inches; with *Kodak 35 f.5.6* and Kodak Portrait Attachment (No. 7A), as close as 25 inches. With *Kodak Duo Six-20, Series II*, and Kodak Portrait Attachment (No. 17), as close as 23 inches.



KODAK COMBINATION LENS ATTACHMENTS

An Adapter Ring is first slipped over the lens mount. It provides a fitting into which any of the accessories may be threaded. Each accessory, in turn, provides a threaded flange to which another accessory can be attached. For example, a Wratten Filter with retaining ring may be attached to the Adapter Ring. A Pola-Screen may be substituted for the filter, or attached over it, etc. Thus the design permits using any accessory by itself or in combination with any other. A Kodak Lens Hood may be added to prevent "lens flare" in bright light.

With a Kodak Pola-Screen, pictures can be taken obliquely through glass or water so that details beyond are clearly visible, without objectionable surface reflections. Surfaces (except metal) can be so photographed that oblique reflections impairing rendition of detail, or good composition, can be subdued. Blue skies can be recorded in any shade from light to quite dark gray, provided the picture is made at right angles to the sun's rays. In Kodachrome photography, subjects can be made to stand out strikingly against dark blue sky.

Retaining Rings (not required with Kodak Lens Hood) make possible the use of any Wratten Filter. These Filters, in unmounted circles cemented in "B" glass, are stocked for the various series as follows: A, B, C₅, F, G,

K₁, K₂, X₁, X₂, No. 1, No. 2A, 85B, Aero 1 and 2, Sky, and 23A. Other listed varieties on special order. For a complete list, write to Eastman Kodak Company. Kodak Lens Hoods are aluminum hoods of fixed size for lenses of usual angle of view (not wide-angle). In ordering Adapter Rings, diameter of lens mount should be specified.

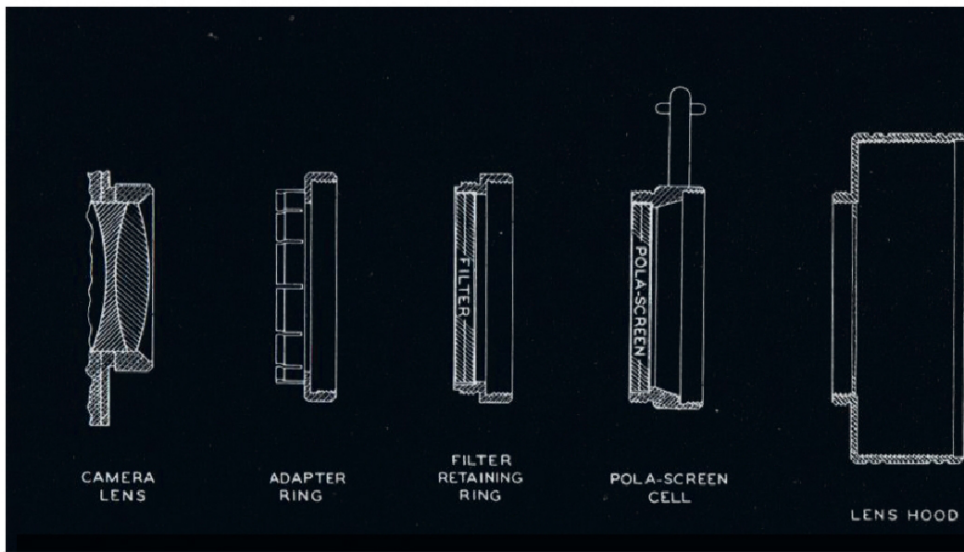

Kodachrome Film gives you all the lovely hues of nature, the charm of colorful indoor settings. Usable at snapshot speed—outdoors, or indoors with Photoflood or Photoflash illumination, employing Type A. No extra equipment required for all ordinary shots; the color is in the film. Kodachrome transparencies may be viewed as they are, or mounted for use in Kodaslide Projectors.

New Mounting Service

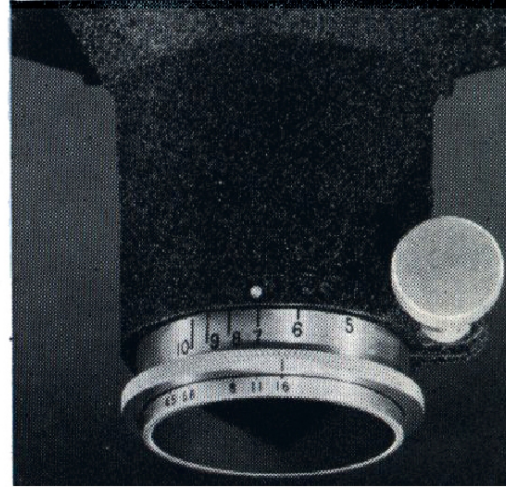
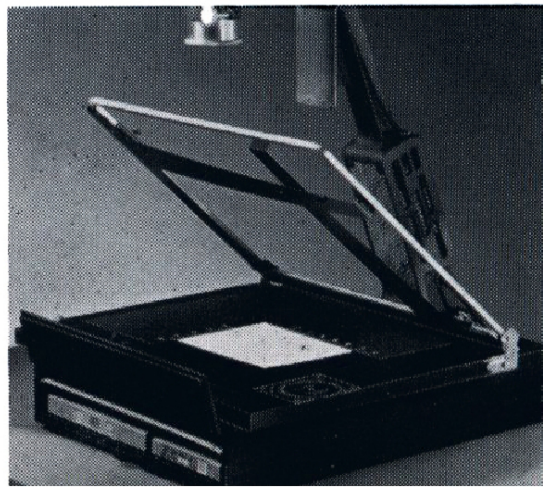
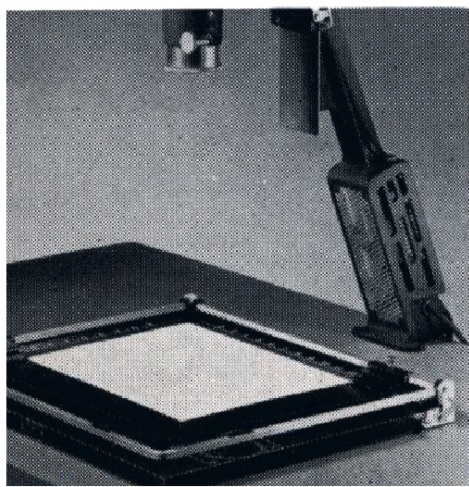

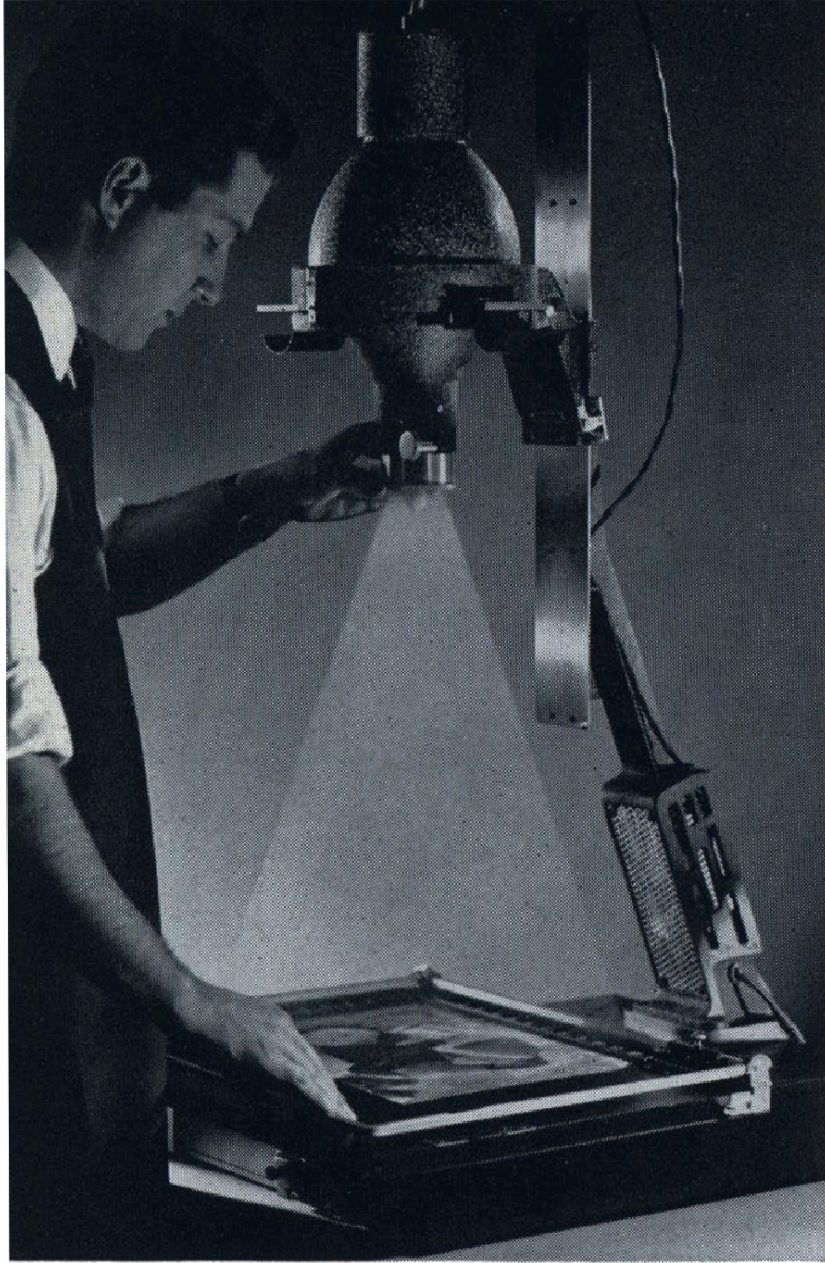
Close-up view showing the enlarger standard, clamped to a table, and the Masking Paper Holder—which is available separately, if desired.

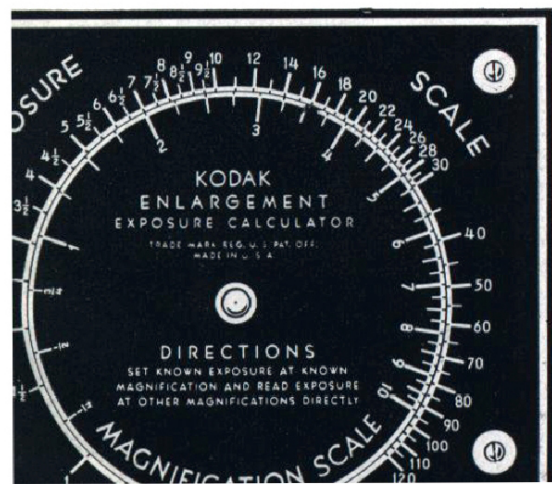
